

GROWING AND HARVESTING HERBS

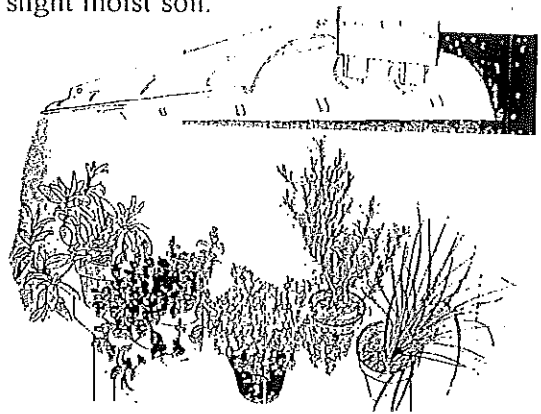
The Indoor Herb Garden

Locate near a bright sunny window or supplement with grow lights.

Plants will tend to be smaller and not quite as aromatic as outdoor grown herbs.

Use well-drained soil-less medium as a planting mix.

Do not overwater. Remember most herbs prefer only slight moist soil.



The Outdoor Herb Garden

Plant your herb garden in a sunny location at least 5 hours of direct sun per day.

A south or west facing bed is best.

Choose a location easily accessible to the kitchen.

Herbs need well-drained, moderately fertile garden soil. Amend if necessary

Water well until plants are well established.

Fertilize lightly, once a month until the end of summer

- Planted between the spokes of a wagon wheel
- Between the rungs of an old wooden ladder
- Bordering a walkway or at an entry
- Tucked in between your hybrid roses
- Planted into a stair-stepped concrete planting bed
- Mixed into 'tropicana' themed garden bed with dahlias, hardy gardenias and bananas.
- Elaborate European knot garden
- Incorporate fragrant and edible herbs into your landscape beds.
