The trees in this list are those well suited to providing cover, nesting sites, food, and shelter for wildlife

Indian Plum (*Osmaronia cerasiformis*)
Douglas fir (*Pseudotsuga menziesii*)
Oregon white oak (*Quercus garryana*)
Cascara (*Rhamnus purshiana*)
Idaho locust (*Robilnia ambigua*)
Red elderberry (*Sambucus callicarpa*)
Black elderberry (*Sambucus melanocarpa*)
Blue elderberry (*Sambucus Mexicana*)
Purple Elderberry (*Sambucus nigra* ‘Purpurea’)
Mountain ash (*Sorbus aucuparia*)
Western red cedar (*Thuja plicata*)
